- Historical breaks in modern and contemporary times in the Mediterranean: new historiographical perspectives.
- Old and new global players in the Mediterranean area.
- Freedom and security in the Mediterranean area.
- Ancient and modern constitutional processes in the Mediterranean.
- Mediterranean, between crisis and cooperation.
- Mediterranean environment: social, legal and economic impacts and dynamics.
- Art, religion, myth, and symbol in the Mediterranean political context.



Applicants must send by 31 May 2021:

- Abstract (maximum length 500 words), in Italian or English
- 5 keywords
- Scientific Curriculum Vitae

Materials must be submitted to the following email: <u>conferencescipog@unime.it</u> Candidates will receive the results of the evaluation by 30 June 2021. Contributions will, then, be peer-reviewed for possible publication.

The Students Conference will be held at the University of Messina on 13-14-15 October 2021.

The work will take place in presence, if permitted by the health regulations in force, in case of impossibility it will be developed remotely.
