Contributions to New Initiatives

- Design of a new PG course. An important contribution that I have made over the past two years has been the design of a new postgraduate course, entitled *Environmental and Natural Resource Economics*, which was introduced in the session 2011/12. The course – which is a core component of the MSc EECC – seeks to develop a rigorous treatment of the theory of environmental and natural resource economics, and to show how formal economic thinking can assist policymaking in areas such as climate change, ecosystem and

biodiversity conservation and water resource management, at different levels of governance.

- Design and restructuring of the MPhil/PhD provision. I have also substantively contributed to the design and restructuring of the MPhil/PhD provision offered by the Department of Geography and Environment. Motivation for this restructuring was the fact that the pre-existing programme did not adequately reflect the growing diversity of research expertise and interests within the Department. As a result of this restructuring process, the Department has now four dedicated focused PhD programmes centred on core research specialisms. Amongst other, I played the lead role in writing the new PhD programme specifications, selecting appropriate training components and electives, and creating prospectus entries for the PhD in Environmental Economics. The programme, which I direct, has so far been extremely successful both in recruiting high quality students and securing funding for prospective candidates.
- Introduction and organization of a new research seminar series. In 2010 I proposed the introduction of a research seminar series dedicated to climate change and the environment. The proposal was welcomed by the School, and I took over its implementation. The series was originally conceived as an internal seminar series where LSE faculty members could present their work-in-progress, receive feedback from colleagues, and exchange research ideas. Due to its increasing popularity, it has subsequently been opened to external speakers from top universities worldwide (e.g. Yale University, Duke University, University of Oxford, and Stockholm University). I currently co-organise the new internal/external seminar series, which has proved extremely successful both in terms of the calibre of the speakers that we have been able to attract and the extent of participation.

11. External Activities and Consultancies

Below is a list of external, professional and other activities in which I have recently been involved:

- I am a member and contributor of the 'Coalition Theory Group', at the Fondazione Eni Enrico Mattei, Venice, Italy. This is a network of researchers from the EU and non-EU institutions with expertise in the fields of environmental economics, game theory, and political science. The research activity of the group focuses on such issues as the strategic formation of international environmental agreements, the application of network theory to environmental and resource economics, and the political economy of international environmental cooperation.
- I participated as a keynote speaker at the 2013 United Nations World Water Day, Rome, Italy. This annual initiative was instituted in 1993 by the General Assembly of the United Nations and features key decision-makers from international institutions and national and regional governments.
- I am involved in the development of a project for a £40m grant to be funded by the Natural Environment Research Council (NERC), DFID, and the Government of India. The project is entitled '*Sustainable Health of the River Ganga System*'. Partner institutions include IIT Kanpur, University of Delhi, University of Southampton, University of Oxford and Durham University. If the project is funded, I will work on and possibly coordinate the economic component of the project.
- I previously worked as an external consultant on a World Bank project concerning the allocation of water resources among production and environmental uses in the Maritsa River Basin, Bulgaria.
